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A Quality Approach to Child Care

The early years of a child's life are crucial. Scientists and researchers around the world have confirmed that brain growth and development of infants and young children are deeply affected by their early experiences. The more that we can ensure that these experiences are positive the better off they will be in the future.

This imparts an enormous responsibility on child care providers. They must work with the parent as a partner in their child's development, respect and support the parent's ideas, and nurture and stimulate their child. In short, a caregiver must provide quality child care.

Quality child care is where all children receive individual care and attention, learn how to get along with others and feel good about themselves. It is clean, safe and comfortable. There is a quiet space for rest or sleep, as well as both indoor and outdoor play areas and a range of toys and equipment for play and learning.

Quality child care has caregivers who genuinely like children and understand their differences. These are caregivers who recognize behaviour that indicates a child needs help, who are aware of cultural and religious diversity, and who are able to offer games and activities appropriate to the ages and developmental stages and interests of the children in their care. They are also able to encourage the self-esteem of each child through warm and loving guidance, and are willing to work with the parent to develop common goals.

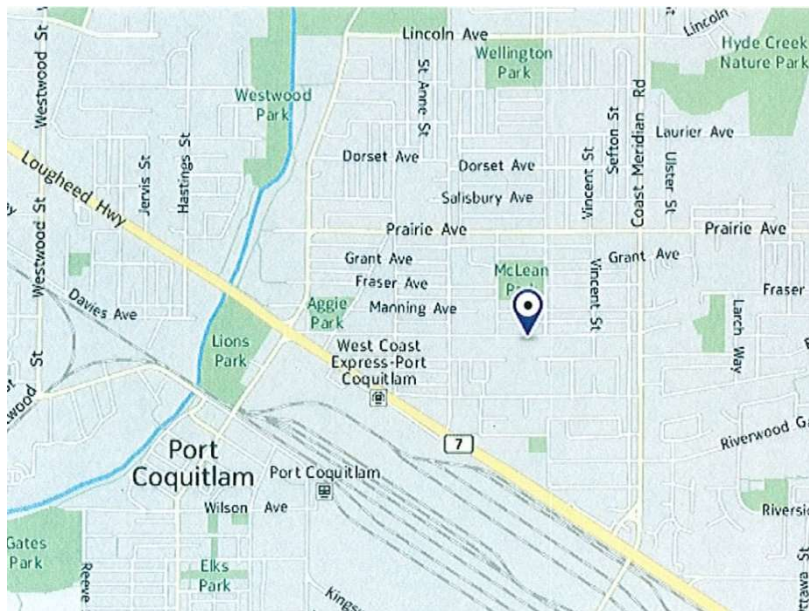

The YMCA CCRR staff has various skills and specialized training and education. All our staff have one thing in common—a strong desire to provide families and child care providers with the information and support they need to enable the children of our community to have the best possible early childhood experiences.

Child Care Resource and Referral Consultants

CCRR Consultants provide families with:

- Child care referrals
- Information on community resources
- General information on the Affordable Child Care Benefit Program
- Assistance in completing the Affordable Child Care Benefit Application
- Community outreach & assistance regarding the Affordable Child Care Benefit Program

CCRR Consultants also act as the first point of contact for parents & caregivers—if you are calling our office and are not sure who you need to speak to, simply enter “0” at any point and a CCRR Consultant will be happy to assist you.

Every child care provider on our referral data base is assigned a personal CCRR Consultant. Your CCRR Consultant has provided their name and contact information in the welcome letter that accompanies this new membership package. Your consultant is available to assist you in many ways, and we encourage you to contact them whenever questions arise.

CCRR Consultants provide families and child care providers with:

- Consultation and support services, including Affordable Child Care Benefit support
- Supportive home visits (mandatory for Registered License-Not-Required child care providers and Licensed child care providers by request)
- Early Learning Resource Library
- Training opportunities
- Opportunities to network with colleagues
- Registration of License-Not-Required child care providers

As a child care provider you will want to contact a CCRR Consultant when:

- You want to make changes to the information on our child care provider database (ie, change in your hours of operation, your program, vacancies, etc.)

Child Care Resource and Referral Consultants

CCRR Consultants provide a wide range of support to child care providers including: organizing networking events; planning training opportunities; providing assistance in the Early Learning Resource Lending Library; and registering License-Not-Required child care providers. They are also available to consult with child care providers on issues related to the operation of their child care—from child development to relationships with parents.

CCRR Consultants provide families with: child care information and referrals; Affordable Child Care Benefit assistance; and provide referrals to community programs and services.

In addition, they assist child care providers with workshop registration and are happy to help child care providers in our Early Learning Resource Lending Library.

Membership Categories

Registered License-Not-Required (LNR)

LNR child care providers may serve up to two children of any age (not related by blood or marriage), in the caregiver's own home. Caregivers registered with the CCRR have completed a registration process which includes such things as:

- An interview
- Criminal Records Checks on all persons residing in the home over the age of 12
- Health and Safety Home Assessment
- References from 3 persons, who are not related, who can attest to the applicants suitability to care for children
- Child care training (minimum 20 hours)
- First Aid Training
- Annual Health and Safety Home Assessments and support visits

If you are considering providing license-not-required child care please contact a CCRR Consultant who will be happy to assist you.

Licensed Child Care

(Includes Family Child Care, Group Child Care (under 36 months); Group Child Care (30 months to school age); Preschool; Group Child Care (School Age); Multi-Age Child Care; In-Home Multi-Age Child Care; Occasional Child Care).

Licensed child care providers have completed a process through the Fraser Health Authority which enables them to have a Facilities License. As such, accessing membership of the CCRR requires only completion of a membership application, and a copy of your Community Care Facility License.

Consultations with ECE qualified staff

Parents and child care providers have access to consultation with our experienced, ECE qualified staff. CCRR Consultants can provide assistance with such things as:

- Child development issues
- Administrative issues such as contracts and policies
- Strategies for dealing with difficult situations
- Programming suggestions
- Suggestions on incorporating resources into your program
- Guiding behaviour

CCRR Consultants are also available to visit your facility upon request.

- Providing helpful suggestions in setting up your child care space
- Providing guidance and assistance with home safety issues for Registered LNR child care providers
- Providing suggestions and demonstrations on how to incorporate resources into your program

Access to training opportunities at reduced member rates

The YMCA CCRR offers a wide range of training and networking opportunities. Workshops and courses are typically offered Wednesday evenings and Saturday mornings at our Tri-Cities location and Thursday evenings and Saturday mornings at our Burnaby office.

Workshops are presented on a wide array of topics, including such things as:

- Child development
- Programming
- Business/administration issues
- Health & Wellness

Networking provides caregivers with an opportunity to meet their colleagues, exchange ideas, and socialize. Networking events are held regularly at both locations.

Access to laminating & photocopying at reduced members rates

Access to provider drop-in opportunities

The YMCA CCRR has lending libraries in our Burnaby/New Westminster and Tri-Cities offices. Our lending libraries contain over 2000 items and include such things as:

- light tables
- activity boxes
- loose parts
- natural materials

Access to community referrals

The CCRR has a comprehensive list of referrals to community services. If you are looking for services or supports in the communities of Burnaby, New Westminster, Coquitlam, Port Coquitlam, Port Moody, Anmore or Belcarra, please contact our offices and we will do our best to assist you!

Enhanced child care referrals

The CCRR maintains a database of licensed and registered license-not-required child care facilities for the communities we serve. The CCRR reviews each parents request using our database of child care programs to help determine special requests and care needs, hours of operation, ages of children, location, and school's serviced. The CCRR will then provide parents with information (both written and/or verbal) on child care to help inform them of their child care options. The CCRR will provide referrals that most closely matches the family's request.

Members of the CCRR are able to provide CCRR staff with additional information on their facilities such as:

- Programming information
- Qualifications of care provider
- Hours of operation
- Languages spoken
- Schools served, etc.

This information is of great interest to parents who are searching for care and it is to your advantage to provide these details. If you need to update the YMCA CCRR on changes to your program information, please contact our Tri-Cities office at 604-931-3400.
