ChildCareBC - <u>Child Care Fee Reduction Initiative (CCFRI)</u>: <u>Funding Guidelines 2022/23</u>: Through <u>British Columbia's</u> <u>Canada-Wide Early Learning and Child Care Agreement</u> with the Government of Canada, additional enhancements will take effect December 1, 2022. ChildCareBC - <u>Affordable Child Care Benefit Service Provider Portal</u>: New! Licensed and Registered Licence-Not-Required providers are invited to register for the My Family Services - Service Provider portal. Registered providers are now able to complete online Child Care Arrangement forms submitted by parents.

BC Gov News - <u>Early childhood education program enrolment rises in B.C.</u>: More people are choosing to pursue studies in early childhood education, which is good news for families, communities, children and B.C.'s economy.

ECEBC - <u>BC Child Care Workforce Survey</u>: If you work in or previously worked in Licensed or License Not Required child care and/or Early Care and Learning in BC, we encourage you to respond to the 2022 BC Child Care Workforce Survey. Now in its fourth year, this survey measures changes over time and provides a comprehensive overview of the state of the ECL sector, including regional information. Please fill it out no later than November 14th.

ECPN - <u>Conversation Series V Part III</u>: Join ECPN pedagogist Teresa Smith with ECPN Director Veronica Pacini-Ketchabaw as they share the pedagogical processes involved in narrating children's dialogues with a 50 -year -old maple tree over four seasons. This conversation will highlight an ongoing inquiry with children who are trying to live well together in unceded Secwepemcúl'ecw. The educators and pedagogist are taking seriously the understanding that children's relations with more -than -human others are deeply meaningful, never innocent, and requiring of thoughtful pedagogical responses.

Are you curious about the resources available in our Early Learning Library? Below are just the few of many we have available for you to borrow and use in your early learning practices!



19452 Sensory Shape Sorting (new resource!)

Check out these flexible silicone materials - stacking arches, minimalist baby nesting, and shapes. These fascinating textured surfaces provide unique and soothing sensory stimulation. The hard wooden surface additionally provides tactile exploration for a calming and massaging sensory experience.



21607 Peekaboo Farm Animals (new resource!)

Peekaboo, I see you! This simple, classic game builds so much into young children's brains each time you play. The visual stimulation creates new brain cell connections and children learn socially about taking turns, eye contact, and give-and-take. Peekaboo develops the ideas of object permanence and that something out of sight is still there. Additionally, the two piece barns help build fine motor skills .



31788 Acorn Soup

Children love pretend play! Do you notice how young children always pretend to be someone or something else? This fun, interactive game is good for children to help identify the ingredients and count as they cook. Mix, stir, eat and play together while developing a child's counting, sorting, finemotor skills.

ARTICLES OF INTEREST



Capital Current - <u>\$10-a-day childcare plan threatened by worker shortage across</u> <u>Canada</u>: StatsCan reports that Canada's childcare workforce shrank by 21 per cent during the pandemic. According to Jim Stanford of the Centre for Future Work, that shortfall and the anticipated expansion of demand under \$10-a-day childcare means an additional 200,000 childcare workers will be needed over the next decade, almost double the current number.

Canada.ca - <u>Government of Canada invests \$3.1 million to study impacts of COVID-19 on children in Canada</u>: Since the start of the pandemic, the Government of Canada put in place crucial science-based measures to protect the health and safety of all, including children. Despite the important protection that these protocols have offered, we know that COVID-19 and measures such as physical distancing and mask wearing have transformed children's day-to-day lives.

Contemporary Issues in Early Childhood - <u>Stop 'under-mind-ing' early childhood educators: Honouring subjectivity in pre-</u><u>service education to build intellectual and relational capacities</u>: The stubborn dominance of objectivity in child observation in pre-service early childhood education warrants letting go of as we confront its limitations as outdated, problematic, Eurocentric, neo-liberal and even racist. In the context of recent aims to establish 'critically reflective' practices, such as 'pedagogical documentation' and 'collaborative inquiry' as the 'new way' to 'do' early childhood curriculum planning in Ontario, Canada, the authors are concerned that the hard work of naming and creating conditions to 'think together' with concepts of subjectivity has been missed and misunderstood.
