Child Care BC - December 2022 changes to the Child Care Fee Reduction Initiative: the BC Government is reducing child care fees again – this time by as much as \$550 more per child every month, for families accessing care at participating licensed child care centres. Funding is being provided directly to eligible child care centres to lower fees - so families don't need to apply to get these additional savings. The BC Government is also significantly increasing funding for child care providers to support their operational costs, and limiting fee increases to ensure stability and predictability for both families and providers.

Child Care BC - Supporting Child Wellness: Public Health Guidance for Communicable Disease (including COVID-19) Management in Child Care Settings: the BC Centre for Disease Control (BCCDC) has updated its public health guidance for communicable diseases.

Child Care BC - Apply for the New Spaces Fund School Age Care on School Grounds Stream: A new application stream has also been launched to support the creation of new licensed spaces for school-aged children on school grounds for school districts, First Nation schools, First Nation independent schools, and notfor-profit independent schools throughout B.C.

BC Gov News - New funding helps make back-to-school more affordable for families that need it most: The Province is helping make back-to-school more affordable for students and their families who are struggling with rising costs of living due to global inflation. Through the Student and Family Affordability Fund, \$60 million will help school districts make sure students are fed and have the school supplies they need to be successful this year.

It is already the month of October and time sure is going by fast! We are entering into the fall season, and it is filled with fun activities such as exploring the change of color in the leaves, Thanksgiving and Halloween. Our following early learning library resources will help give you some fall inspiration and activity ideas in your program planning.

33644 Fall Leaves

Trees, leaves, rocks, and real acorns will inspire children's curiosity about nature and the seasons. This resource also comes with a story book about a bear's first experience with the changing seasons and it is perfect for the littlest listeners.



07770 Loose Parts - Fall

Open-ended materials give children the freedom to play and explore. They can be arranged and rearranged, and essentially be used by children to create their own rules and designs, allowing the focus of the experience to be on the process.



05097 Fall Exploration

Not only do the leaves change colour, but insects also change in the fall, too! Discover these changes by talking with children about what bugs are doing, where they live and where we can find them. Share your experiences, and help children learn and explore a variety of insects.

00254 Leaf Tiles

This is hands-on, interactive learning that help explore different types of leaves. Try placing paper over a leaf tile and rub it with a crayon to show the intriguing textures of fall leaves.



33958 Halloween Stories

Do you need circle time songs and stories for Halloween? This resource comes with easy and simple lyrics (sung to a popular tune) and a felt story. Easily create your own Halloween Story with the children with this wonderful resource.



31598 First Halloween

Halloween is fun and playful. These story books are perfect for infants and toddlers and are a great introduction to Halloween. Children will enjoy playing with ghosts, shapes, gravestones, houses, and wooden blocks.









ARTICLES OF INTEREST

Parent's Canada - After School Meltdowns? There's A Name For That: "The first month of school is under our belts. If you've noticed more challenging behaviours than normal in the after-school hours, you're not alone. Increased hyperactivity and meltdowns after school are so common, they even have a clinical name: after-school restraint collapse".

Canadian Centre for Policy Alternatives - Alternative Federal Budget 2023: Rising to the challenge: An agenda for public leadership (child care chapter): "The authors draw attention to the transformation of child care in Canada since the historic commitment to child care system-building outlined in the federal budget 2021. The report emphasizes that an effective transformation will require strong public leadership to move from Canada's longstanding, failed, market-based approach to a publicly managed system that recognizes, values, and funds child care as a public good".



Unicef - It's Difficult to Grow Up in an Apocalypse: "It has also been noted that young Canadians were more vulnerable during lockdowns, reporting lower well-being and a decrease in mental health (Hawke et al., 2020; Statistics Canada, 2021). This may be due to school and daycare closures, which had an impact on some children and young people with underlying issues (e.g., those experiencing abuse or poverty) because it limited their access to opportunities and support (such as safety or nutrition). School closures have also been reported to impact on friendships, and cause isolation and feelings of anxiety and depression among many students (Public Health Ontario, 2020; Li et al., 2021). In addition, the pandemic created inequalities in the system, as young people experienced different levels of access to education and health services, placing some children and youth at greater risk than others (Whitley et al., 2021)."
