NEW! September 2023 Preschool and School-Age expansion of CCFRI:

- the Child Care Fee Reduction will be expanded to include children enrolled in licensed preschools and children in Grade 1 to age 12.
- beginning September 1, 2023, families at participating licensed preschools and school-age child care facilities will receive fee reductions of up to \$145 per month per child.
- child care providers can apply to the Child Care Fee Reduction Initiative starting on January 31, 2023. Facilities offering licensed preschool and child care for children in Grade 1 and up are encouraged to apply early so that by September 2023, even more families will see meaningful reductions in their child care fees.

NEW! My ChildCareBC Services: Starting January 31, providers can use the new My ChildCareBC Services platform to apply for funding starting April 1 for Child Care Operating Funding, the Child Care Fee Reduction Initiative, and the ECE Wage Enhancement.

NEW! Updated guidelines have been released on ChildCareBC's website:

- 2023/24 ECE-WE Funding Guidelines
- 2023/24 CCFRI Funding Guidelines

Updates to the 2023/2024 ECE-CFI Funding Guidelines Include:

- Provide the parents of any newly enrolled child in writing, details around your approved participation in CCFRI.
- You must advise parents of enrolled children of any relevant information to this Agreement in the form and frequency directed by us in writing.
- The status of, or results of any investigation by the Ministry into your compliance decreasing Parent Fees and/or distributing ECE Wage Enhancement Funding in accordance with this Agreement can be released to the public.

<u>ChildCareBC Awards of Excellence</u>: Do you know a child care provider who is going above and beyond to help children achieve their best? Nominations for the 2023 ChildCareBC Awards of Excellence are now open.

<u>Child Care Provider Appreciation Day – open survey:</u> ChildCareBC invites child care professionals, providers, staff, parents, and the greater child care community to vote for their preferred day for this year's Child Care Provider Appreciation Day.

NEW! <u>Autism and Neurodiversity in Early Childcare</u>: Free Self-Paced Online Program. This program is designed to assist childcare providers, early childhood educators, preschool teachers, parents and anyone interested in inclusive childcare to learn practical strategies on how to support young children with developmental disabilities, including autism (diagnosed or undiagnosed) in the early childcare setting. In fact, the strategies presented in these modules can help any child thrive in their early years!

Discover Loose Parts #36183

Loose parts play encourages children to be creative, and helps them develop skills such as critical thinking and problem-solving. Loose parts also allow children to understand cause and effect as they build and play, discovering what works and what doesn't. This helps grow children's confidence, as they can choose how to play – there is no right or wrong way. Loose parts give children the chance to explore, experiment, learn, and have fun!



Lighthouse #33164

Policy Options - Building an anti-racist child-care system in Canada: "In 2021, a Montreal daycare flagged a three-year-old Black child for "troubling behaviour," deciding to call Quebec's youth protection services before having a meeting with the child's parents. The parents – both of whom had previously received only positive feedback about their son from daycare staff – were shocked."

ECEBC - Media Release: Findings from the recent report "Evaluation of Early Care and Learning Recruitment and Retention Strategy" in British Columbia are now available: The Early Childhood Educators of BC (ECEBC) is pleased to share the Evaluation of the Early Care and Learning Recruitment and Retention Strategy in British Columbia, Evaluation Report. Funding for this report was provided through the Canada-British Columbia Labour Market Development Agreement.

Vancouver Sun - Some B.C. daycares limiting hours, turning away kids because of staff shortages: "In the past two years, we've had to close programs temporarily, whether it's for a day or two, or shorten hours for the week ... in order to meet the licensing regulations for ratios and also the qualifications that are required for those specific programs, especially in infant and toddler care. In some cases, after-school care was suspended because staff was sick. We have significant wait lists for certain age groups, and we would like to expand but we can't consider that right now with ... the recruitment and retention issues," Merton said."
