### 2022 Annual Report

The YMCA of Greater Vancouver Foundation has promoted, supported and funded the YMCA to build healthier communities for this generation and generations that follow. Our work—now as the YMCA BC Foundation—is more important than ever.

The uncertainty of the past few years has left our communities dealing with new challenges and changed realities. We've seen how the impact of the pandemic has limited the ability for many to focus on their personal wellbeing, created feelings of isolation among everyone from children to seniors, and heightened anxieties about what the future holds.

Community service providers like the YMCA have needed to be creative, flexible and adaptive in their approach to helping its members and program participants. We're proud to look back on 2022 with the knowledge that the Foundation's strong financial position allowed us to continue supporting the advancement of the Y's mission amid difficult times.

The Foundation is pleased to share with you that our total assets of more than \$105.7 million at the close of the year represented an increase of almost 10.5 per cent over our 2021 valuation. Key highlights and milestones achieved in 2022 illustrate the Foundation's impact on the YMCA to support people, places and programs serving our communities.

Thanks to our donors and board stewardship, the Foundation was able to grant nearly \$3.2 million toward YMCA programs and initiatives over the course of the year. Notably, this included \$820,000 dedicated to social infrastructure, reflecting our capital funding commitments in support of the brand-new Bettie Allard YMCA in Coquitlam—which held a Grand Opening Celebration in 2022—and the newly named Bob Chan-Kent Family YMCA in Chilliwack. Other areas of granting to highlight include \$345,000 to support post-pandemic recovery efforts and \$120,000 to help youth make lifelong memories at YMCA Camp Elphinstone, where we were thrilled to see campers welcomed back for the first time since 2019. As well, the Foundation provided \$135,000 to aid the YMCA of Greater Vancouver, Kamloops Community YMCA-YWCA and YMCA of Northern BC pursue unification to become YMCA BC.

Our own evolution into the YMCA BC Foundation was also completed in early 2023, but we remain steadfast in our mandate to support the Y's endeavours. We have an exciting opportunity to engage new donors, add members to our Heritage Club that is already more than 250 people strong, and build upon our 108 named funds that collectively exceed \$25 million.

We are forever grateful for your generosity and encouraged to know that the Foundation is poised to make an even greater impact across the province going forward. Your support allows us to continue making a meaningful difference and leave a lasting legacy in communities served by the YMCA.
