

ECEBC - Media Release: New report recommends BC Early Childhood Educators earn at least \$30 to \$40/hour: The creation of new child care programs is not happening fast enough in BC, or across Canada. The major roadblock to expansion is the worsening Early Childhood Educator (ECE) staffing crisis. To address this issue, the BC government committed to develop and implement an ECE wage grid. With this commitment in mind, a scan of ECE wages and wage grids across Canada, including a detailed analysis of ECE wages in BC was carried out by the CCCABC and ECEBC.

Global News - B.C. falling behind on wages for early childhood educators amidst staff shortage: Report: British Columbia is falling behind on wages for early childhood educators (ECEs) compared to other provinces as it expands its \$10-a-day child care program, a new report has found.

University of Alberta - More understanding and support needed for family day home educators, says researcher: "While daycare centres have more staff to share the varied responsibilities, the job of a family day home educator is much more "multi-faceted," Woodman says. "We provide child care, program planning for children of mixed ages, menu planning; we're the chefs, the janitors, the administrators and the business owners." That bundle of challenges is at the heart of research the University of Alberta doctoral student is now doing to help raise awareness of what family day home professionals need so they can thrive. "As single operators they need to be better understood and supported in the child care system." While the field of early learning and child care is well researched, the experiences of day home educators are less represented, says Woodman.













Early Learning Library Corner

Playing with water during summer not only offers a refreshing escape from the heat but provides opportunities to promote physical activity, improve sensory development and a deeper understanding of water concepts.



11806 Waterplay

Through spinning wheels and pumps, incorporate concepts like buoyancy (sink / float), water cycle, and water displacement (volume). This can deepen a child's understanding of water concepts while having fun.

29501 Coral Connections

Liven up your water table with these marine organisms. Introduce coral reefs and the different sea creatures that inhabit them. Encourage children to investigate the relationship of corals and marine life. Spark discussions on environmental awareness and how these corals affect marine life.





20328 Travel Over the Sea

Imagine the journey on the water with different types of vehicles. Set up a pretend "ocean" with blue fabric. Encourage children to engage in role-playing activities where they can take on different roles like sailors, fishermen, or even ocean explorers.

00023 Woodland Fun

Water does not only affect marine life but also all living things on Earth. On the topic of environmental awareness, extend discussions by emphasizing its relationship with creatures on land and air. Inspire children to be stewards of nature.
