YMCA Child Care Resource & Referral (CCRR)

- One of 38 provincially funded Child Care Resource & Referral programs who provide CCRR services in 40 locations throughout the province.
- Funded by the Ministry of Education and Child Care and administered by the YMCA of Greater Vancouver.
- Office locations in Coquitlam, Burnaby, and New Westminister, and serves the communities of Burnaby, New Westminister, Coquitlam, Port Coquitlam, Port Moody, Anmore & Belcarra.
- Operates two family resource programs: one in Port Coquitlam — “Circle of Friends” at James Park Elementary and the other in Coquitlam at the Bettie Allard YMCA.

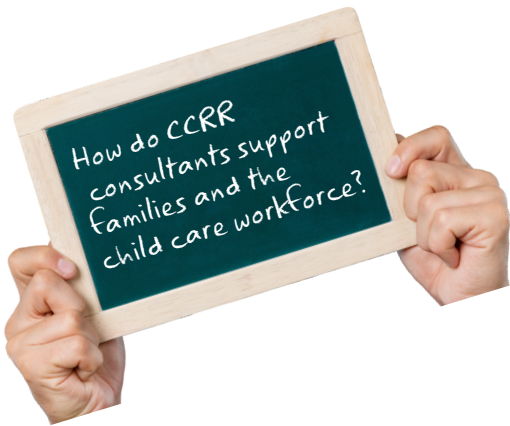
Children will have the opportunity to socialize, learn new skills, play with toys, take part in an art activity, sing songs, enjoy stories, have snack time and more!

We support Families by providing:

- Child care referrals
- Early Learning Resource Library support
- Parenting Education Workshops
- Information on community resources
- General information on the Affordable Child Care Benefit Program
- Assistance in completing the Affordable Child Care Benefit Application
- Community outreach
- Drop-In Programs



We support the child care workforce with:

- Consultation and support services, including Affordable Child Care Benefit support
- Supportive home visits (mandatory for Registered License-Not-Required child care workforce and Licensed child care workforce by request)
- Early Learning Resource Library
- Training opportunities
- Opportunities to network with colleagues
- Registration of License-Not-Required child care workforce

The YMCA CCRR tracks new vacancy spots every month when you submit claims for the Child Care Operation Funding. Vacancies are updated monthly using the Child Care Map BC and indicated to parents on child care referrals sent from the CCRR.

YMCA Child Care Workforce Categories:

Registered License-Not-Required (LNR)

LNR child care workforce may serve up to two children of any age (not related by blood or marriage), in the caregiver's own home. Caregivers registered with the CCRR have completed a registration process which includes such things as:

- An interview
- Criminal Records Checks on all persons residing in the home over the age of 12
- Health and Safety Home Assessment
- References from 3 persons, who are not related, who can attest to the applicant's suitability to care for children
- Child care training (minimum 20 hours)
- Annual Health and Safety Home Assessments and support visits
- First Aid Training

If you are considering providing license-not-required child care, please contact our CCRR Consultants who will be happy to assist you.

Licensed Child Care

Licensed child care workforce have completed a process through the Fraser Health Authority which enables them to have a Facilities License. As such, accessing membership of the CCRR requires only completion of our membership form.

Licensed child care includes:

- Family Child Care
- Group Child Care (under 36 months)
- Group Child Care (30 months to school age)
- Preschool
- Group Child Care School Age
- Multi-Age Child Care
- In-Home Multi-Age Child Care
- Occasional Child Care

Program Service Benefits

▶ Consultations with Licensed Early Childhood Educators

Parents and child care workforce have access to consultation with our experienced, ECE qualified staff. CCRR Consultants can help with such things as:

- Child development issues
- Administrative issues such as contracts and policies
- Strategies for dealing with difficult situations
- Programming suggestions
- Providing suggestions and demonstrations on how to incorporate resources into your program
- Guiding behaviour; CCRR Consultants are available to visit your facility upon request
- Providing helpful suggestions in setting up your child care space
- Providing guidance and assistance with home safety issues for Registered LNR child care workforce



▶ Early Learning Resource Library Access

The YMCA CCRR has lending libraries in our Burnaby/New Westminster and Tri-Cities offices. Our lending libraries contain over 2000 items which are included in the following categories:

▶ Training and Networking Opportunities

Networking provides the child care workforce with an opportunity to meet their colleagues, exchange ideas, and socialize. Networking events are held regularly throughout our service areas.

➤ Enhanced Child Care Referrals

The CCRR maintains a database of licensed and registered license-not-required child care facilities for the communities we serve. The CCRR reviews each parent's request using our database of child care programs to help determine special requests and care needs, hours of operation, ages of children, location, and school's serviced. The CCRR will then provide parents with information (both written and/or verbal) on child care to help inform them of their child care options. The CCRR will provide referrals that most closely match the family's request, including those with vacancies.

Child care workforce can provide CCRR staff with additional information regarding their facilities such as:

- Programming information
- Qualifications of care provider(s)
- Hours of operation
- Languages spoken
- Schools served, etc.

This information is of great interest to parents who are searching for child care and it is to your advantage to provide these details. Users of the CCRR program services have access to the laminator at our Tri-Cities office. The laminator is extra wide and can accommodate poster size materials. Please call ahead if you wish to use the laminator and we will ensure it is available to you when you arrive. CCRR program users are welcome to photocopy materials at either location. Unfortunately, due to high color printing costs we are only able to offer black & white printing only.

Photocopy Rate: \$0.25 per printed page

➤ Seasonal Resource Sheet

Every seasonal quarter, (Spring, Summer, Fall, Winter), the CCRR releases a resource sheet that includes program planning to help supplement your early learning curricula.

➤ Public Computer Access with Wifi

Both our Burnaby and Tri-Cities offices have public access computers which are available to our CCRR program users.

Feel free to come in and do research, download forms or articles on the internet, use the computer to prepare your contract, or prepare information for parents, etc.
