



Letter from the Chair and CEO

Serving as a pivotal moment in our Foundation's history and evolution, there is no question that we will be looking back fondly upon 2023 for some time. This past year, we officially reintroduced ourselves as the YMCA BC Foundation, taking on a name that mirrors our commitment to uplifting and championing the newly formed YMCA BC and its many life-enhancing community supports.

But there was much more to celebrate than just a new name. We widened the scope of our support to match YMCA BC's expanded service area, and it was with great pride that the Foundation extended 2023 grants to YMCA programs unique to the Kamloops and Northern BC regions for the first time. In just a couple of examples, programs like Beyond the Bell were able to continue offering crucial school support for Prince George students facing economic and academic barriers with the help of Foundation funding, while the Kamloops-based Mindful Monkeys initiative is utilizing a grant to help even more preteens develop coping strategies for anxiety and stress at no cost to their families.

With a growing Y to support also came the need to enhance our expertise and representation in communities newly gathered under our umbrella. We were pleased to welcome two new faces to our Board of Directors from Northern BC and Kamloops—Rikki Beaudet and Joanne Bonderud, respectively—and it's been wonderful to add a lens of regional insight as we adapt to meet the needs of the new YMCA BC and those we serve.

So much of this important work takes place behind the scenes, and it requires a committed team of governance volunteers who guide the Foundation in making essential community investments, and in fiscal responsibility to ensure its resiliency for future generations. The Directors who comprise our Board and serve in Committee roles manage investments and help to shape granting decisions, Foundation finances and donor relations with great care. We appreciate their dedication and contributions throughout the year.

As always, the biggest highlight of the year was the inspiring generosity of Foundation donors, without whom none of

these efforts would be possible. Our total of named funds has now grown to 109, as more and more individuals and families consider the value of establishing a long-term legacy through the Foundation. We cannot express enough gratitude for our Heritage Club members, whose legacy gifts ensure that the ideals they care for deeply continue to prosper through our support for YMCA BC.

Our first year as the YMCA BC Foundation proved that our farreaching impact is poised to grow in harmony with a Y that now serves more than 55 communities across the province. Your support is as critical as ever as we build a brighter future for all.

As we look ahead to our new beginning as YMCA BC, we can reflect with pride upon our tremendous, 136-year legacy of helping children and families reach their potential—from the Sunshine Coast to the Fraser Valley and all points in between, and now extending to across BC.

We invite you to look back on our many 2023 successes in the pages of this report, and thank you for your continued support of the YMCA as we serve communities in our province on an even wider scale.
