Articles of Interest

Remembrance Day: How to explain it to a toddler? It's a day to honour the brave soldiers who gave their lives to protect our country, and those who continue to serve for our freedom. While the history behind it is complex, it's important to help children understand the meaning of this day in ways they can relate to.

Inclusive Child Care resources and supports: All children thrive in inclusive child care environments that embrace and celebrate the diverse identities of children, families, and staff. Child care professionals are dedicated to creating inclusive programs, but they sometimes require assistance to ensure that every child can participate fully. Some child care experts specialize in inclusivity, while others are just beginning their journey towards it. To establish genuinely inclusive child care as a fundamental service, a comprehensive, system-wide approach to inclusion is essential. British Columbia's Inclusive Child Care Strategy outlines this holistic approach.

New Report: Vast Majority of Canadian Kids are Bullied and Don't Feel Supported in School: A recent report reveals that a significant number of Canadian children experience bullying and lack support in their schools. It identifies the ten most pressing threats to childhood, which are worsening, with alarming rates of bullying, mental health struggles, and poverty. The report urges policymakers and all Canadians to take immediate action and emphasizes the importance of youth engagement in developing effective solutions.



Early Learning Library Corner ... Sophie's Picks!



This kit is ideal for sharing during the fall season, featuring a selection of nutritious indigenous foods sourced from the land, the ocean, and foraged items. Children will have the chance to explore various cooking practices that have been passed down for thousands of years and are still used today. These include traditional methods such as utilizing a smokehouse and techniques for preparing fish. The play-based learning experience incorporates interactive playsets, which consist of a 20-piece cooking pot set and a cedar gathering basket filled with berries—perfect for practicing counting and identifying colors.
